Conserving A Land's History

In June 2024, the 65-acre **Sanford Dominguez Agricultural Conservation Easement** was protected after nearly 12
years of dedicated work on the project. This section of the historic ranch, located in the blue oak woodlands of South County, holds significant cultural landmarks, including bedrock mortars carved by early Nisenan peoples and rock walls built by Chinese immigrants in the 1860s.



Art Into Nature

BYLT is the proud recipient of an inaugural **Arts in California Parks** grant to support artists, culture bearers, and the community in creating artworks that offer perspective on our past and present. Over the next 18 months, the grant will be used to expand our Arts In Nature programming, bringing a breadth of visual arts, poetry, and music onto our preserves and trails.




Youth Movement

Leading The Way

High on the ridge above the South Yuba River sits
Governor's Hill, named for Jerry Brown who once owned
it. The community on Montezuma Ridge has cherished
"Governor's Trail" as a fire break and a connection to North
Columbia. In 2024, the landowners generously donated
trail easements across their joint properties to ensure this
section of the trail remains open and accessible forever.



A Plan For Recreation

Nevada County took huge strides in 2024 to embrace the outdoor recreation economy through the adoption of their **Recreation & Resiliency Master Plan**. BYLT plays a pivotal role for recreation in Western Nevada County as we continue to expand upon community recreation needs. BYLT 's newest team member, Recreation Manager Erik Marquis, will help bring our trail vision to life.



On The Move

As cities on the western slope of the Sierra expand, BYLT's goal to protect critical **migration corridors** for wildlife becomes ever more urgent. A major migration route runs north from the Bear River to the Lower Yuba River and follows the South Yuba River all the way to the High Sierra. BYLT continues to protect contiguous ranches and open spaces along this route, ensuring wildlife their vital journeys.
